Permanent position openings

SPP – The **Service de Physique des Particules (Division of Particle Physics)** at CEA/Irfu is considering the permanent recruitment of a physicist in 2009.

The **deadline for application** is **March 8, 2009**. Candidates must have a PhD or their PhD defence must be scheduled during the first semester 2009.

The SPP comprises a hundred physicists working on about 15 international experiments. Close to 50% of the activity is devoted to collider experiments at the energy frontier (ATLAS, CMS, D0, ILC), the other 50% being shared among CP violation (Babar, NA48), neutrinos (Double-Chooz, T2K), and astroparticles/cosmology (Antares, Edelweiss, Hess, Olimpo/Planck, SNLS, BAO).

We welcome motivated candidates with an excellent scientific level, having completed their PhD preferentially within the last 5 years. It is important to us that candidates like to work in a team and are willing to interact positively with all research activities in the laboratory. The research fields we would like to strengthen particularly with a new recruitment in 2009 are neutrino astronomy, direct dark matter searches and accelerator-based neutrino physics. However, all applications on research projects within the particle physics division will be considered and no prior activity in our preference fields is required for a successful application.

For an application we require:

- Curriculum Vitae
- Letter of motivation
- Description of the candidate's scientific activity (3 pages at most)
- Description of the candidate's research project (1 page at most)
- List of publications and internal notes emphasizing the personal contributions of the candidate, with a copy of the most significant ones (3 at most)
- List of talks at conferences, workshops and seminars
- 2 letters of recommendation (which should be send *directly* to the address below)
- 2 to 3 names of persons to be contacted for further references

Only **complete** applications will be considered.
